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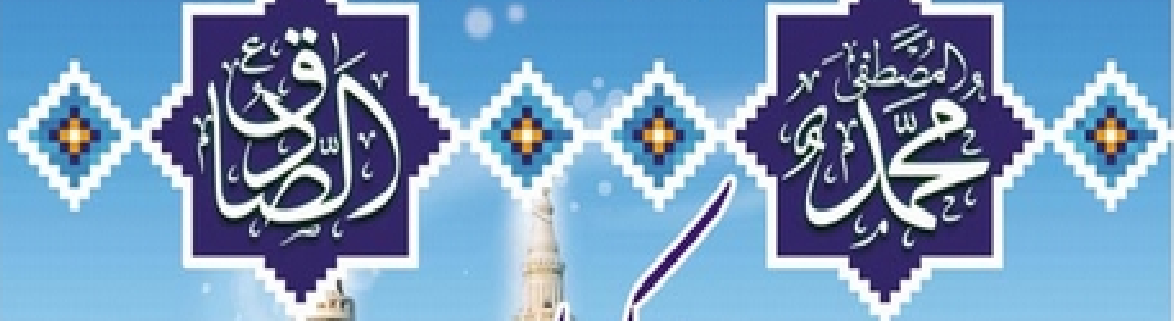

## Haftai Wahdat: The Week of Unity

**H**afta-e-wahdat :The week of unity Islam the religion of peace and tolerance which always favoured unity and gave us the system which established within us the sense of morality and its visual rectification. It transformed the fragmented parts of each of our individual beings into the unbreakable synchronized and accustomed cultural and religious harmonies. It paved way for a vision where the individual differences of language, culture, colour, proved much less than the greater love with which a Muslim was solemnly blessed. In each of a Muslim individual, the prophetic love could be seen gushing out to such an extent that every other love seemed to be of no importance at all or very less importance for him. It is the same love which outspokenly made us to reign for centuries, a Muslim was a name in modern sciences . The likes of Ibn Al-Haytham, Jabir ibn Haiyan, Ibn sina and Al-Razi have left a glittering image of Muslims in mirror of science and technology. During the past few hundred the image a Muslim has been reduced to nothing with a Muslim being hated all over the world. Being a Muslim nowadays is a tag of being a terrorist. A Muslim is no longer referred for a query in science and technology. A Muslim who was admired and respected all over the world for his goodness of character is now looked down in every corner of the world. If anywhere in this world there is conflict, it is in a Muslim country. If anywhere humanity is plundered, behind it are the hands of a Muslim. Why this state of misery, why this bloodshed, why this hatred??? The only answer to this question is we have lost the Prophetic love which once simmered our hearts. As said by Allama Iqbal (R.A)

*"Hath bezor hain ilhaad se dil khugar hain  
Ummati haalsey ruswayey paighambar  
hain"*

The disgrace which we are met with in every part of the world is due to leaving the prophetic traditions of love and compulsion for fellow human beings in general and the fellow Muslims in particular. The disunity among the different sects of our religion has brought disgrace for us in every part of the world. The followers of one sect don't see the other sect as a part of ummah but is treated as being a secondary religion . One sect sees in other sect as a sense of alarming danger. A Muslim who

was at once a protector of his fellow Muslim is now shedding blood of his fellow brother and that too in the name of religion ,the peaceful Islam! Allama Iqbal (alehirahma) highlights this mutual harmony and unity as;

*"Qom mazhab se hai, mazhab jo nhii thi  
tum bhii nhii  
Jazb e Baham jo nhii mehfil e anjum bhii  
nhii"*

In Quran Allah says "And hold fast ,all together, unto the bond with Allah, and don't draw apart from one another" (Al-Quran 3:103).So it's a fervent order of Allah to a believer to maintain harmony and be united with one another. For believers the Prophet (Pbuh) says: innama al-mu'mineena ikhwah, "truly the believers are one brotherhood". The great visionaries and thinkers paved up new ways to fonder this concept of mutual respect and harmony amongst the muslims.

In Arab, the period before the birth of our Prophet (SAWW) is referred to as the "dark period" where humans were more like beasts with no moral character, it was the period when an individual of one tribe was hungry of the blood of some other tribe. The prophet made them to change by flushing in them the character of awe. Nowadays, the tribal fights have took a new shape of a inter-sectarian conflicts. So, the birth of prophet is the right time to once again look at the prophetic traditions and with which Allah will have mercy on us, mina'z zulumati ilan noor "He brings them out from darkness into light" According to the traditions narrated from Sunni scholars the birthdate of the final Prophet of islam falls on 12th Rabi-ul-Awal while the Shia Imamia Ulema consider 17th Rabi-ul-Awal as the exact birth date.Imam Khomeini realising the vitality of the situation and need of the hour, presented a unique solution to this divergence to preserve and foster unity amongst the sections of Islam by declaring the entire week between 12th and 17th Rabi-ul-Awal as week of celebration and Muslim solidarity. I would like to praise him for his outlasting contribution for the unity concept with my own couplet as;

*"Eik Mard e Mujahid ne Touqeer kyaa hea  
likhi  
Aesa lag raha hea Taqdeer e khuda hea  
likhi"*

Today the Muslim Ummah, for its life , its own dignity and to raise the standards of the religion of Allah, needs unity. What things generate

divisions among Muslims? Resting those things has priority over every other urgent necessity. If our enemies succeed in imposing their power and occupying our lands, the world of Islam will be left further behind the modern world of science and technology of which we were masters at once. We are accountable . We are all responsible for ensuring that the Ummah doesn't fall further behind in any way. I want to conclude it with a Iqbalian couplet as; "kisi yakjaye se abb ehd e ghulaami karlo Millat e Ahmad(saww) ko maqaami kar lo".

### Daesh, brainchild of west to disperse Muslims: Top Iranian Sunni cleric



Tehran: Prominent Iranian Sunni scholar called Daesh as brainchild of the west and a means to damage Muslim world. Molvi Mohammad Eshaq Madani, Sunni member of the World Forum for Proximity of Islamic Schools of Thought, warned against Daesh as an anti-Islamic plot from within Muslim community created by world arrogant powers. Sunni cleric, participating the fifth conference on Shia Sunni fraternal ties in Kerman Province, referred to the disagreements among Muslims demanding for solutions to the issues so that the enemies do not misuse the difference as an opportunity against Muslims. Sunni figure highlighted Prophet Mohammad (PBUH), holy Qur'an and Qibla (praying direction of all Muslims) as the commonalities that should be maintained by all Muslims. Molavi Eshaq Madani added, Enemies have launched wide range of efforts in line with Islamophobia for instance they design desecrating caricatures of the Prophet Mohammad (PBUH) to provoke Muslims and then introduce Muslims as violate and uncontrollable. He also referred to followers of Christianity and Judaism for solving their disagreements while Muslims are standing against each other providing beneficial opportunities for the enemies. Prominent Sunni scholar demanded Muslims to solve their minor differences and maintain their common enemies. Attended by outstanding Shia and Sunni clerics, fifth conference on Shia Sunni fraternal ties was held in Kahnuj County, Kerman Province.
