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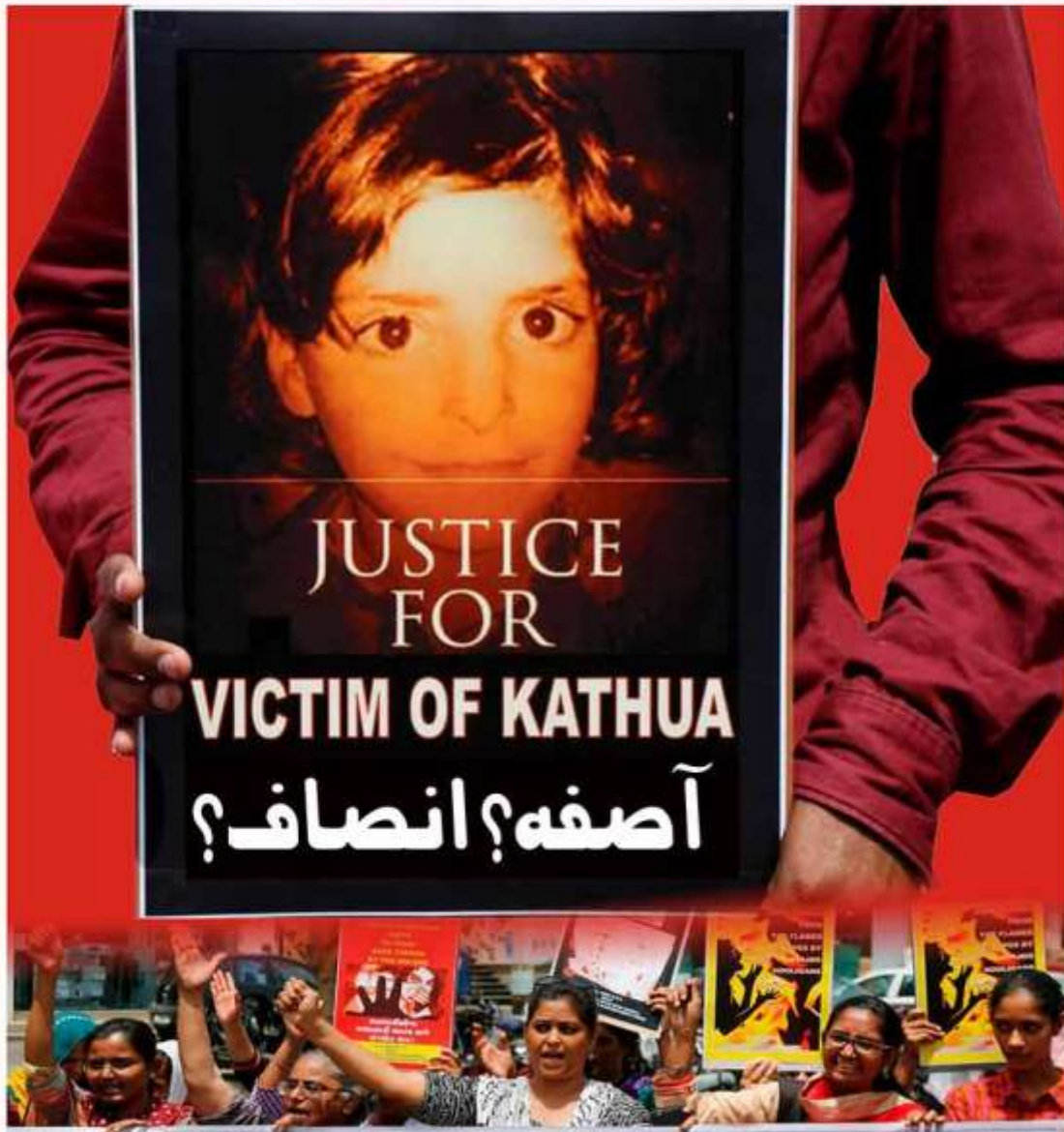

Tehran: On the anniversary of day of Muhammad's (PBUH) appointment to prophethood (Eid al-Mab'uth), a group of government officials and Muslim states' ambassadors to Iran met with Ayatollah Khamenei—the Supreme Leader of the Islamic Revolution—this morning, April 14, 2018.

Ayatollah Khamenei slammed the attack on Syria launched by the United States, Britain and France, and asserted: This morning's attack on Syria is a crime. I firmly declare that the U.S. president, the president of France, and the Prime Minister of Britain have committed a major crime. They will gain no benefit; just as they did not while in Iraq, Syria and Afghanistan, over the past years, committing the same criminal acts.

The Leader of the Revolution touched on the hypocrisy behind the U.S.'s scapegoat for bombarding Syria by stating: "Those who once supported ISIS, discreetly, claim to oppose them [ISIS] today and somehow defeated them: that is an apparent lie. U.S the played no role in defeating ISIS."

Ayatollah Khamenei then pointed out additional statements of deceit, from the U.S. side, indicating, "In his speech, a few hours ago, the US

president said they could defeat ISIS in Syria: another shameless and obvious lie!"

Furthermore, he informed the audience on the truth of U.S.'s relationship with ISIS: "They, where they thought it was necessary, entered and helped [ISIS]. When the main elements of ISIS were encircled, they saved them. Even before that, they were involved in creating ISIS."

The Leader of the Revolution reminded the Iranian officials of the U.S.A.'s manipulation of other countries and their failed plot, stating: "Using the Saudis' and their allies' money, they could create these vile creatures that would attack the nations of Iraq and Syria. However, the resistance against the US and its agents could save these two countries: the outcome will be the same in the future."

Ayatollah Khamenei further elaborated on U.S.A.'s failure in the Middle East, warning them that failure would occur again if they tried to invade the region. He said, "Just a few days ago, the US president announced that they've spent seven trillion in Western Asia—or the Middle-East as he called it—and they [U.S.] gained no profit. He is right: they didn't gain a thing. The US must know, from now on, no matter how much they spend or how much they endeavour, they will gain nothing from this region!"

He added: "In different regions of the world, Muslims are under intense pressure: they [USA] support and help the oppressors of Muslims. They are

indifferent toward the troubles and pains inflicted on Muslim nations. USA also supported the cruel dictator Saddam [Hussain]. Thousands of people from Iran and Iraq were killed or injured by the chemical weapons used by Saddam. They [USA] are not always against chemical weapons [as they claim]; however, they get involved due to their own arrogant aims, with the excuse of countering dictatorship; nevertheless, they operate as one international dictator. The Leader of the Revolution then reminded his audience, "Well, dictators will never succeed; they will certainly be defeated."

Ayatollah Khamenei asserted: "We should be aware in face of these events and vigilant: Muslim nations, countries, governments should gain experience. They want to damage the Islamic Ummah. Syria, Iraq, or Afghanistan are not the only targets: the main target is the presence of Islam in this region; they want to damage this. Islamic countries must understand this; Islamic governments should not act in favor of the goals of the US and some other invasive Western countries."

At the end Imam Khamenei emphasized that the withdrawal of arrogance and oppressors from the world due to resistance is a divine tradition and I hope that the nations of Iraq, Syria, Afghanistan, the oppressed nation of Palestine, Myanmar and the people of Kashmir will push their enemies back with the help of resistance in the near future."

SSP Mr. Ramesh Kumar Jalla, who along with his team, completed the investigation in Asifa's rape and murder case in Kathua in "record time," arrested all the accused, and submitted the charge sheet on April 9, which was at least 10 days ahead of the 90-day deadline fixed by the High Court. He is a Kashmiri Pandit, and he exposed the Hindutva bigots who admittedly raped and murdered Asifa. He was under tremendous pressure from the BJP ministers who had also participated in the protest march of the Hindu Ekta Manch. But he didn't budge and care.

Deepika is from a Kashmiri Pandit family, which had left their ancestral village of Karthama in North Kashmir in 1986 and moved to Jammu. She filed a writ petition that the Jammu and Kashmir High Court began monitoring the case and the investigation was handed over to the Crime Branch. She said that such heinous acts of rape have no religion has promised the nail the accused in this case which has further deepened communal fault lines. She is facing threat by some anti human forces.

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KATHUA RAPE CASE ROW

No Culprit Will Be Spared: PM Narendra Modi

Rahul Gandhi challenged PM Modi to speak up on the two rape cases



New Delhi: In his first remarks on the Kathua and Unnao rape cases, which have sparked nationwide outrage, Prime Minister Narendra Modi today said no culprit will be spared. "Incidents being discussed since past two days cannot be part of a civilised society. As a country, as a society we all are ashamed of it," the prime minister said. "I want to assure the country that no culprit will be spared, complete justice will be done. Our daughters will definitely get justice." PM Modi added while speaking in Delhi this evening. Earlier today, Congress president Rahul Gandhi had challenged PM Modi to speak up on the two rape cases, calling his silence "unacceptable".

"What do you think about the growing violence against women and children? Why are accused rapists and murderers protected by the state?" Rahul Gandhi had tweeted.

Rahul Gandhi had led a midnight march

to India Gate in the heart of Delhi demanding justice for the eight-year-old girl who was kidnapped, brutally assaulted and killed in Jammu and Kashmir's Kathua in January, and for the 16-year-old girl in Uttar Pradesh's Unnao who was allegedly raped by BJP lawmaker Kuldeep Singh Sengar last year.

Mr Gandhi had said last night that the Beti Bachao (Save the girl child) slogan is good. "We are telling him (PM Modi) that he should get down to the job, implement it," the Congress president had said during the protests that are seen to be an effort to put the ruling BJP at the centre and the two states in a spot.

Rahul Gandhi had led a midnight march to India Gate at midnight demanding justice in Kathua, Unnao rape cases.

Hundreds of people, predominantly Congress workers, had joined the march, responding to Mr Gandhi's call to join him for "a silent, peaceful, candlelight vigil" to protest violence against women and demand justice. The Congress today said it will stage protests across the country demanding justice in the two cases.

Though the Kathua rape and murder took place in January, central politicians were largely silent until details in a police chargesheet revealed the sheer cruelty and horror that the

child was subjected to before she was killed. Meanwhile, in Uttar Pradesh, Kuldeep Singh Sengar has paraded around all week long denying the accusation of rape, disparaging the girl and her family and hitting out at the media in the Unnao rape case. During that time, his brother Atul Singh was arrested for a brutal assault on the girl's father, who was not just arrested with severe wounds on his body but who died on Monday in custody.



Kuldeep Sengar was taken in for questioning by the CBI early this morning. The Allahabad High Court today severely reprimanded the Yogi Adityanath government, and said the approach of the government law officer that the lawmaker could not be arrested at this stage "not only exudes an unpleasant flavour" but raises doubts about the bona fides of top police officers.

Kathua Rape and Murder Case echoed in United

United Nations: The uproar over the horrific rape and murder of Kathua Child is echoing at global stage. In this regard, UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres stated that he wants Indian authorities to ensure that the perpetrators of the "horrific" gang rape and murder of an eight-year-old girl in Jammu and Kashmir's Kathua be brought to justice.

His Spokesperson Stephane Dujarric told reporters that he has seen reports about the "horrific case" of the abuse and murder of the nomadic Bakerwal community girl.

"We very much hope that

the authorities will bring the perpetrators to justice so they can be held accountable for the murder of this young girl," he said.

The minor was kidnapped on January 10, and taken to a temple in Kathua, drugged and gang raped over days and finally killed to scare the nomadic Muslim community out of the village. Her body was found dumped in a forest near Rasana village seven days later. Pertinently, Eight people, including four police personnel - a head constable, a sub-inspector and two special police officers - have been arrested in the case and charges filed against seven of them,
